Editorial;

It also began in the United States in the 1960s by African-American and was later spread till it found foot beyond its origin, becoming prominent in the writing of Black Consciousness Movement by South African Steve Biko.

"When you say 'Black is beautiful' you are saying, 'Man you are okay as you are, begin to look upon yourself as a human being'." ~ Steven Biko.

The movement aims to tackle the notion that the black-skinned race is relatively ugly and are less attractive, admirable and significant to the whites. It also encouraged a stop in the skin toning through lightening or bleaching, and hair hennaing; intending to eliminate identified black traits.

What's already in existence is worth showing – come and see.


On The Theme;

'Black Is beautiful' is a theme coined out of the need to reveal the ingrained grace in the colour 'BLACK' with what it depicts.


As Africa and her habitations are considered a black society, the need to utter, iterate, and reiterate, of which cannot be overemphasized, that Africa's black is truly beautiful.

Have you ever sat down to reason this colour up-down? Or try to snap it's beauty with the mind camera? Well, follow closely to know the unknown!






Black Is Beautiful - By D' Unique Gem.

"Ezeadakonobi" Royalty doesn't leave a clan




Black is Magical - By Victor Onyebuchi.

Interview Section - Featuring Ejike-Ezeani Vivian (Queen Chija); a model, and a compere.



And this would affirm our claim at ArtingArena that we are into creativity; and creativity in its whole. This time our network of discovery has found a creative mind; Ejike-Ezeani Vivian (Queen Chija), a model and a compere.

Read on to see our chat with a mind from another genre of art.

Interviewer - Welcome to ArtingArena. This section would see us interviewing you based on what you do; modeling. This insinuates that at ArtingArena, creativity is what we are after. Anything related to aesthetic creation, and showcasing it; that is our vision and mission. Once again, welcome, and thanks for being here for us.

Who is Ejike-Ezeani Vivian (Queen Chija)?

Answer - Ejike-Ezeani Vivian is a 26yr old Model, Model Instructor, and Compere, born and raised in Onitsha. She hails from Umukegwu, Akokwa in Ideato LGA of Imo State, a certified Electrical and Electronics Engineer graduate of Federal Polytechnic Oko.

Interviewer - The next question should be what has academic contributed in your career. But they aren't related.

How did you chose your career?

Answer - I have always had this flair for modeling and fashion as people kept asking me if I was a model. After realizing this is something I'd love to do, I got trained and ventured into it.

Interviewer - Being a model, what is the first required thing you have to do?

Answer - I had to train as a model for a year, learnt the business aspect of modeling as well. I had a personal instructor, Mr Felix Amobi, and later on learnt the business aspect from Mr Akeem Shittu, Mr Uchenna Obizoba and Mr Davidson Okoro. I'd say I had private tutors.

Interviewer - And what is modeling?

Answer - Modeling is the art of exhibiting, showcasing, advertising, and displaying the creative work of an artist for creative purpose as well as commercial purposes. The artist can be a writer, a photographer, a content creator, a fashion designer, a makeup artist etc.

Interviewer - What inspires you to modeling?

Answer - Being a creative person, modeling gives me the room to be very artistic, so this inspires me to keep modeling.

Interviewer - You first modeling experience, tell us about it.

Answer - It was an outdoor photoshoot with Kolex Photography. Having to give different poses, and for the first time at a mechanic workshop. After taking a lot of pictures only one came out nice.

Interviewer - What are the challenges you faced as a model?

Answer - Models face a whole lot of challenges. But to mention a few: as a model, I had people judge me (because of the mentality people have of models being prostitutes), I've also had men make advances towards me because of that same mentality, the biggest challenge was getting jobs because I couldn't get into a good modeling agency, I had to do some free stuff for people. It was quite difficult for a while, but we good now, yay!

Interviewer - About being good now, congratulations. In modeling, do you have limitations? What are the things you can never do?

Answer - For now things I wouldn't do are: I can't have piercings to fit into a particular description for any Creative Director, another is, I can't go bald (smile).

Interviewer - Briefly talk about the social life of a model.

Answer - Models are trained to be extroverts because it is needed in everything about modeling. From runway shows, outdoor shoots, video shoots etc, a model learns to socialize in order to work well with other artistic people like make up artists, photographers, videographers and other models too. In rare cases we have models who are introverts and are doing well in the industry.

Interviewer - Are there disciplines related to your career? Like nutrition, fitness, etc. Tell us more. And how you cope.

Answer - Yeah, a whole lot. Like one's got to eat healthy, keep fit, take care of his or her skin and be fashionable. Eating the right foods and the right time matters a lot to a model. Models have to avoid processed food and eat more of natural foods with less carbs. Fitness is almost the same thing, doing the right exercise to keep fit and healthy like the plank, the glute, the glute fearsome foursome etc. Plus you never stop training.

Interviewer - Aside photography and fashion, are there other aspects related to modeling? **Answer** - Yes, we have Vixing (the art of being a video vixen).

Interviewer - How do you think modeling relates with art?

Answer - Modeling relates with art through creativity. From the definition I gave earlier, just as art speaks or passes a message, so does modeling when it showcases the creative work of an artiste.

Interviewer - Modeling in Africa? What's your view about it. Is it what is should be? **Answer** - So far so good, modeling in Africa is evolving. Modeling in Africa showcases originality. In fact people around the world want to identify with African tradition and culture. So I believe in Africa we're where we want to be and also growing higher.

Interviewer - Would you choose to model for foreign countries over Africa?

Answer - I would Choose Africa. Because I believe in what we igbo's call Aku Ruo ulo. I want to keep it home. And even if I take the opportunity to model for foreign countries, I will showcase the African heritage to the world.

Interviewer - Something about Africa and it's interaction with art (1)in general (2) with modeling.

Answer - Africa since the beginning have been more artistic than any other continent, from our language, folktales, dance, music, artistry etc. We have a lot of connection with Art. Now when it comes to modeling, our melanin skin, hairstyles, way of life in so many ways interact with art. Most foreign agencies come to different countries in Africa to scout for models because they know we interact so well with our artistic lifestyle.

Interviewer - Your expectations in the path you've chosen?

Answer - I want to make a strong impact in the modeling industry in Africa, Nigeria and especially in the eastern part of Nigeria. And I think i'm achieving that gradually.

Interviewer - Something for model wannabes.

Answer - I tell my students a lot, modeling requires, hardwork, discipline, patience, humility, intelligence and good social skills. To be the master of this craft, one has to keep evolving, just as modeling evolves.

Interviewer - Something about ArtingArena

Answer - I love the fact that someone thought of a way to portray Africa's artistic exposure to the world and its actually real, like its real man. And I'm happy to be part of this dream, like who wouldn't be part of something this big.

Interviewer - Thanks so much for your time, one last time on this section, we are happy to have you here.

Answer - My pleasure.


